IT'S SPRING; BLOOM TIME FOR BETTON'S NEIGHBORHOOD CONSCIOUSNESS!

I have never met a person who doesn't enjoy living in Betton Hills. Whether it's talking with neighbors or dog walkers, monitoring Facebook posts, or reading neighborhood-based articles in the newspaper or magazines, residents' love for Betton Hills comes through clearly. That's very touching. There are few neighborhoods that have such a caring bond with their residents. I consider that caring bond a neighborhood consciousness. We take care of our neighborhood and take care of one another.

Your BHNA strives to strengthen that bond. We focus our efforts on making Betton an evermore friendly, safe, and uplifting neighborhood. With spring as the traditional time for renewal, I encourage you to reflect on ways we can improve Betton as a community . . . what we can do as a neighborhood association and what we can do individually. There are two words that stand out to me that guide my thinking about neighborhood consciousness: caring and joining.

Take Time to Care

As spring lifts our spirits, we become more active. We get out around the neighborhood, do more yardwork, play more sports, etc. before the summer furnace heats up. What can we do to take the time to care? Here are a few basic suggestions:

On the streets

§ There are more neighbors out walking and bicycling. If you're driving, slow down for them. Don't hesitate to swing wide to avoid them. Share a short wave of hello.

§ Give walkers and bicyclists the right of way at crosswalks and intersections. Stop if necessary.

§ If you're walking or biking, move to the side of the road as a car approaches. If the car is approaching you, look at and wave to the driver.

§ If you're walking or biking, feel free to pick up litter that may be on the street. Bring a trash bag with you or, if trash bins are near the street, put litter in them.

In the yard

§ In spring and summer, yardwork picks up. No surprise there! One of the things many neighbors appreciate dearly around here is quiet. Consider that as you think of times to mow or blow. Avoid early morning or meal times, as possible.

§ House solid waste/trash at the street can be unsightly. Try to put it out close to the scheduled pick-up day.

Around the house

§ While crime is not a huge issue, there are flare-ups of auto burglary and, more rarely, home break-ins in spring and summer. Take valuables out of your car and lock it at night. For your house, take reasonable precautions while at home and on vacation. See guidelines at the Betton Hills website under the Safety tab (<https://bettonhills.us/safety>.)

§ If you see suspicious activity, it's best to call police rather than get involved directly. If you choose to get involved, don't let assumptions rule in uncertain situations. Seek first to understand, then to be understood. (Cont'd pg. 4)

Take Time to Join

We live in a beautiful neighborhood. Take time to join with it! Walk our tree-shaded streets, enjoy the houses and yards, and play in our parks. As you get out and around, say hello to neighbors you meet. Feeling bold? Do more. Start a conversation. Create the connections that make a neighborhood a home.

JOIN BETTON HILLS 2019 PLAN FOR READINESS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS (PREP)

Do the memories of Hurricane Michael make you shudder a bit about what's ahead? You aren't alone! Please join us as we continue to implement the **PREP** program in Betton Hills. Our goal is for our neighborhood to be prepared for disasters by being able to respond to our own needs until emergency managers, responders and utility crews arrive. **PREP** helps us determine neighborhood assets and needs. This includes checking with our neighbors to identify: *volunteer leaders*; tools (e.g., chainsaws, axes, etc.); resources (e.g., gas cooking equipment); materials (e.g., extra tarps, plywood); *skills* (first aid, medical skills, mechanical skills), and *people who may have needs that require special attention* (e.g., have disabilities, need oxygen or other equipment that requires electricity, infirm, etc.).

Participation is totally voluntary. Each leader can take responsibility to cover the number of homes they feel they can manage. This year thanks to **Nurse Gini Hosford West** we will

focus greater attention on the elderly in our neighborhood and others who may require special attention.

Hurricane season begins June 1st, so the time for preparation is now. Please come to a meeting this month where we will meet with neighbors who have already volunteered to take leadership roles for their blocks/streets. Since our neighborhood is so large, we need many more neighbors to engage as leaders for their street or block. The meeting dates/times/location will be posted on our neighborhood website (bettonhills.us), the Betton Hills Neighborhood Facebook page group, and sent out in an email announcement.

Please step up for **BETTON PREP!** It's enjoyable and helps our neighborhood and our neighbors especially those needing special attention. Betton Hills covers a huge area with over 800 households. Most of us who live in Betton Hills like it because it is beautiful, safe and has friendly, helpful neighbors. PREP helps organize those helpful neighbors so that all of us are safer. Training is provided, and simple, short forms are already available to organize the information. **Our goal is to have a PREP leader on every block.** By having more leaders, we can cover more of our neighborhood and reduce the amount of work for each leader. With a lot of hands, we can do this!

DON'T LET SOLID WASTE MESS THE PLACE

Betton Hills is a standout neighborhood in Tallahassee. Many have gardens that speak to their love of nature and beauty. Many residents participate in the events sponsored by the Betton Hills Neighborhood Association and that reiterates their love and value of the place where they live.

Homes in the subdivision consistently hold their value. The community has become a place where others seek to live because of its mature tree canopy and its easy access to the rest of the city. The number of houses being updated to make them attractive to today's home buyer seems to be increasing. These remodels add to the esthetics of the community.

Keep Curb Time Short

But one thing that is a mystery is the fact that many of our neighbors leave unwanted items like old furniture, construction trash, broken appliances and even toilets out on the curb. Perhaps there's a sense that someone else will want the item. OK. Place your solid waste at the curb a few days before the scheduled pickup. That gives the trash cruisers a few days to pick it up. (You may need to call to schedule a pick-up for some discarded household items. See <https://talgov.com/you/you-solidwaste.aspx>). You can also advertise to neighbors for a quick item pickup on the Betton Hills Neighborhood Facebook Group.

The City provides a weekly recycling service, yard waste pick-ups and periodic hazardous waste events to collect unwanted items. The schedules for these events are provided to residents on an annual basis and are also available on the City's website (see link above).

Better Yet

Remember, there are places that will take useable items such as Habitat for Humanity, Goodwill, and the Salvation Army. If the item is reusable, take one extra step and get it to one of these non-profits: the item will have a much better chance of being recycled and you'll help with the mission delivery of the organization.

Let's make use of these city and private services and ensure that Betton Hills remains one of the most coveted neighborhoods in which to live in the Big Bend.

ARBOR DAY: PRODUCTIVE AND RESTORATIVE!

It was a cloudy but warming morning for Arbor Day at McCord Park this year. Nearly 25 volunteers turned out to plant native trees, remove invasive plants, care for past plantings and maintain nest boxes. We gathered at 9:00 AM, getting fired up with hot coffee, hot chocolate, delicious pastries and bagels.

We got a lot done in two hours! This year we benefited tremendously from volunteer efforts of five professional arborists, one arborist in training (the owner's 7 year old son who worked as hard as the adults), and one administrator from **Arbor Pros**.

Many volunteers worked on cutting and bagging ardisia berries and then digging and bagging the plants. Here is a plea for anyone reading this to **please scout for ardisia in your yard and cut off the berries** (and nandina while you are at it). Put them in a bag and place in your trash barrel.

Without our efforts at removing the invasive non-native plants, the McCord woodlands would become a solid mass of invasive species which have little to no value for native wildlife. They crowd out and shade our native species which have unique ecological relationships with wildlife.

We continued our restoration of the woodland along Armistead. We planted three trees (swamp chestnut oak, red cedar, hophornbeam). Next time you are in the park, take a look at this area and picture what it would look like had we not been planting beneath the tall tree canopy all these years.

This year we began work on rescuing the native azalea grove in the northwest corner of the park. The wild azaleas were literally covered by vines. We cut and painted the vines to prevent sprouting and pulled what we could from the azaleas. We also pulled encroaching seedling trees, most of them

invasive non-natives.

All-in-all it was amazing how much our crew accomplished in two hours! It was a lot of fun working and talking together while we worked on the common goal of making McCord Park a vibrant, safe, and clean sanctuary for animals, plants, . . . and people!
